The International Competition of Young Musicians launched in 1999 runs on the basis of the Far Eastern State Institute of Arts once in two years with the support of the RF Ministry of Culture, the newspaper *Muzykalnoye Obozreniye (Music Review)*, the Association of Music Competitions of Russia, the Administration of the Maritime Province, and the Administration of the City of Vladivostok. The leading information partner is the Primorye (Maritime Province) Public TV.

The object of the competition is to reveal and support young talents, raise their professional level and performing skill in all stages of their training, improve the level of performing skill in the region of The Russian Far East as well as strengthen cultural ties with the countries of the Asian Pacific region.

The competition held within the walls of the educational institution stimulates the participants to improve their performing and professional skills and encourages them to pursue their music career in future. The event makes them realise how prestigious the profession of musician may be.

The importance of the project is in the favourable conditions it creates to develop young talents, who constitute the cultural potentiality of this country. The project will serve to draw the attention of younger generations to the achievements of world culture and increase the number of people dealing in creative and performing arts, who will constitute the nucleus of the national culture. Conferences on teaching methods, public lessons and master-classes are to be held within the framework of the competition.

## CONDITIONS OF THE COMPETITION

The competition is held in two stages: the first one is carried in remote form. Those who passed the first stage are invited to the second one held internally in the Far Eastern Institute of Arts.

The competition is open for musicians of four age groups (see below.)

The date determining the age is April 1, 2024 (for all age groups.) The participants may appear in elder age groups if they perform the appropriate programme.

The winners of the Grand Prix and 1<sup>st</sup> Prize of the previous competition may participate only in the older age group following the one, in which they appeared earlier. The winners are to take part in the final concert as well as the concerts organised by the Organising Committee after the competition.

## **COMPETITION PROCEDURES**

### **(for soloists and ensembles)**

The participants contest publicly in one or two rounds.

All music pieces are to be performed by heart (without sheet music.) An exception may be made for some percussion instrument players.

The order of performances will be set up by sortition to be observed within each age group and in each category up to the end of the competition.

All the participants will be provided with an opportunity of an acoustic rehearsal before each round (10-15 minutes).

### **JURY**

The Jury of the competition works according to the regulations approved by the Organising Committee.

Each performance in all categories and age groups is rated on 25-point scale individually. To enter the second round, the participant should get no less than 18 points. The points got in the two rounds being summed up, the general result determines the winners. Basing on the results of the rounds, the Jury awards the “Grand Prix”, the First, the Second, and the Third Prize with a gold, silver, and bronze medal in each age group, category, and specialty as well as Diplomas.

#### **The Jury reserves the right:**

- to award diplomas to teachers for having trained the winner;
- to awards diplomas to the accompanists of the winners;
- to award certificates of merit for participation in the 1<sup>st</sup> and the 2<sup>nd</sup> tour;
- to stop the performers who exceed the time limit or whose performance is below the level of the international contests;
- to award not all of the prizes or share one prize between several participants.

#### **The Jury’s criteria for assessing the performances are as follows:**

- the artistic individuality and natural giftedness;
- the ability to convey the style of the composer;
- the ability to perform all the works according to the style of the composer and that of the period;
- the culture of playing;
- the technical mastery of the performer.

**The decisions of the Jury are final not to be altered or withdrawn.**

### **COMPETITION SCHEDULE**

**1<sup>st</sup> Stage** (qualifying one): January 10 – February 10, carried out in absentia.

Opening Ceremony: April 1.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Stage.**

1<sup>st</sup> Round: April 2-4, 2024;

2<sup>nd</sup> Round: April 5-4, 2024.

Closing ceremony, awarding procedure, and concert of winners: April 8.

## THE ORDER OF PARTICIPATION

1. The deadline for applications for the competition is **February 15, 2024**; for those for the video-competition, it is **March 1, 2024**.
2. The application forms may be filled up in computer on the website [www.dv-art.ru](http://www.dv-art.ru) in the propose form. They may be submitted electronically as well the application form being fulfilled and sent attached **in the format of Microsoft Word only** to the address [muzvladivostok12@gmail.com/](mailto:muzvladivostok12@gmail.com). Each contestant or each company (ensemble, orchestra, or choir) should fill up the application as an individual file.
3. The theme of the e-mail letter with application should contain the instrument, age group, and the name of the contestant (e.g., Violin. 2<sup>nd</sup>. Paul Smith).
4. The documents being received, the Organising Committee acknowledges the receipt and sends an official invitation to the candidate to the submitted e-mail. *If, in the course of five days, the candidate does not receive any acknowledgment, it means that the application has not been received. In this case, he/she should contact the Organising Committee through e-mail.*
5. The applications sent after the 15<sup>th</sup> February 2024 will not be considered.
6. The applications which do not follow the standard will not be considered.
7. The applications sent in other formats than Word (e.g., PDF, JPG, etc.) will not be considered.
8. If the candidate's programme does not correspond to the programme requirement, the application will not be considered and the invitation will not be sent.
9. No changes in the programme are permitted after the application has been accepted.

## REGISTRATION OF THE PARTICIPANTS

1. The Organising Committee does no render visa support to the participants of the competition.
2. When being registered, the participant should produce a copy of the passport or that of the birth certificate as well as a declaration of the participant's agreement to process his/her personal data. The declaration should be signed by the participant or his/her legal representative (in case if the participant is underage.)
3. The entrance fee for the category "Soloists" is 3,000 roubles for Russian citizens, 5,000 roubles for foreigners. Those of the category "Ensembles" and "Video-Competition" are to pay 3,000 roubles for the entire company (for Russian citizens); foreign participants are to pay 5,000 roubles.
4. The entrance fee is to be paid when the participant is being registered at the Organising Committee. It may be transferred to the bank account of the Institute as well. To perform a non-cash transaction, an agreement should be concluded. The agreement form and bank account will be posted on the web-site of the Institute in January 2024.
5. The entrance fee for the participation in the video-competition should be transferred to the account of the Institute marked '**Entrance Fee for Participation in Video-Competition**'. The sender should specify the name of

the company and the name of its director. **The data should coincide with those of the application.**

6. Travel expenses are to be covered by the participant's institution or the participant himself/herself.
7. The Organising Committee does not reserve hotels for the participants. The information on the hotels will be posted on the web-site of the Institute in January, 2024.
8. Travel costs of the participants are paid by their institutions or by the participants themselves.

### **VIDEO-RECORDING REQUIREMENTS (The Video-Competition Category)**

1. Video-recording is to be made at the concert in the presence of audience.
2. Video-recording is to be made without stops, editing, or phonogrammes. External microphones are permitted (without processing the audio signal.) The order of the pieces performed should correspond to that of the programme in the submitted application. The video file should contain only the competition programme. The video-recordings breaking the requirements will not be accepted.
3. The application should contain: the category, the name of the company, the members of the company (the director and the performers) as well as **the timing** of each piece of music performed.
4. Video-recording should be sent electronically together with the application **no later than March 1, 2024. It may be an attached file or a hyperlink the cloud storage.**
5. The collection of the video-recordings of the winners will be posted on the website of the Institute of Arts.

### **TO BE NOTED!**

**No companies performing pop and rock music as well as those using sound-amplifying and audio signal processing equipment may participate in the competition.**

### **FINANCING OF THE COMPETITION**

The competition receives the financial support from the RF Ministry of Culture and uses extra budgetary and sponsor funds.

1. A prelude and a fugue from *Das Wohltemperierte Klavier* by Bach or two three-part inventions.
2. The first movement (sonata allegro) of any sonata by Haydn, Mozart or Beethoven.
3. A concert or a technically complicated étude on the competitor's choice.
4. An obligatory étude: the Étude N 12 or 24, op. 299, by Czerny.
5. A cantabile piece by a composer of the 19<sup>th</sup> – 20<sup>th</sup> century.

Time limit: 20 min.

##### Second Round

A programme on the competitor's choice including one or more compositions of concert character (solo).

Time limit: 20 min.

##### 2<sup>nd</sup> Age Group

(up to 19 y.o.)

##### First Round

1. A prelude and a fugue by J. S. Bach or D. Shostakovich.
2. The first movement (sonata allegro) of any sonata by Haydn, Mozart or Beethoven.
3. A technically complicated étude by Chopin, Liszt, Skryabin or Rachmaninoff.
4. An obligatory étude: the Étude N 14 or 23, op. 740, by Czerny.
5. A cantabile piece by a composer of the 19<sup>th</sup> – 20<sup>th</sup> centuries.

The duration of the programme of the 1<sup>st</sup> round may not exceed 25 min.

##### Second Round

A programme on the competitor's choice including one or more compositions of a concert character (solo) or a concert for piano with orchestra (in whole or separate movements.)

The duration of the programme of the 2<sup>nd</sup> round may not exceed 25 min.

##### 3<sup>rd</sup> Age Group

(up to 25 y.o.)

##### First Round

1. A prelude and fugue by any composer (Bach, Shostakovich, Shchedrin, Taneyev, Glazunov, Hindemith.)
2. A long-form piece by Haydn, Mozart, Beethoven, or Schubert (in whole.)

3. A technically complicated étude by Liszt, Rachmaninoff, or Skryabin.
  1. An étude by Chopin from the opus 10 or 25 (with the exception of those N 3, N 6, N 9 from the opus 10 and N 1, N 2, N 7 from the opus 25.)
  2. A cantabile piece by a composer of the 19<sup>th</sup> – 20<sup>th</sup> centuries.
- The duration of the programme of the 3<sup>rd</sup> round may not exceed 45 min.

### **Second Round**

A programme on the competitor's choice including one or more compositions of a considerable difficulty (solo) or a concert for piano with orchestra (in whole or separate movements.)

The duration of the programme of the 3<sup>rd</sup> round may not exceed 30 min.
